He's been waiting for a chance to visit with you, but your life is so busy with work, family and school, your line is always busy. Jesus can't get through to you. It's time to give yourself a break. Take a little time out for a private visit with your best friend, Jesus. The whole **purpose of our human existence** is to live forever with the Blessed Trinity in heaven, to enjoy forever, the victory of Jesus over sin and death.
