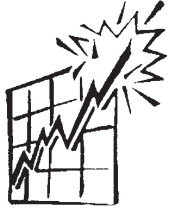

Parish Nurse Health Education:

There are a lot of good reasons to **quit smoking, whatever your age.**

Giving up smoking at any age will increase life expectancy, provided you stop before you develop cancer or another serious disease.

The sooner you give up smoking the better. After:

- 20 minutes - your blood pressure and pulse return to normal
- 8 hours - nicotine, carbon monoxide and oxygen levels in your blood begin to return to normal
- 2 days - your lungs start to clear and your sense of taste and smell begin to return
- 3 days - breathing is easier and your energy levels increase
- 2-12 weeks - circulation improves and exercise gets easier
- 3-9 months - breathing problems, coughing, shortness of breath and wheezing improve
- 5 years - risk of having a heart attack falls to about half that of a smoker
- 10 years - risk of lung cancer falls to about half that of a smoker. You have the same risk of a heart attack as someone who has never smoked. Parish Nurses at 346-0660 or e-mail them at totcparishnurses@gmail.com.

When two people love each other, they want to spend time together to visit, to get to know each other better. You cannot love someone you do not know. Adoration of our Lord in the Eucharist is your chance to know Jesus better. One of the best aspects of Eucharistic adoration is this: how you spend your time with Jesus is entirely up to you. There is no one preaching to you, reading to you, telling you when to stand, sit, kneel, sing or whatever. You are on your own. You can spend your time with Jesus any way you want. You can pray your Rosary, you can read your Bible, or you can do some other spiritual reading. Remember, you are there to visit with your friend, Jesus. Talk with Him; tell Him your problems, your needs or your concerns. Tell Him about your joys, too. He's been waiting for a chance to visit with you, but your life is so busy with work, family and school, your line is always busy. Jesus can't get through to you. It's time to give yourself a break. Take a little time out for a private visit with your best friend, Jesus. The whole **purpose of our human existence** is to live forever with the Blessed Trinity in heaven, to enjoy forever, the victory of Jesus over sin and death. ALL EMPLOYEES AND VOLUNTEERS WORKING WITH CHILDREN: The following information is taken from the letter sent by Monsignor Kurt H. Kemo, Vicar General.

Our present **Decree on Child Protection** promulgated on March 5, 2003 states, "Every five years the Review Board will offer to the Bishop recommendations for improving this Decree and its implementation." (Section II, B.1.a)

Over the past year our Diocesan Review Board has worked on improving our current Decree. Bishop Conlon has accepted the recommendations and will promulgate a new decree in September. In conjunction with this effort our Diocesan Safe Environment Committee has worked on improving our Safe Environment Program.

In order to prepare all those who minister to children and young people for the new Decree and revised Safe Environment Program, we will be offering four (4) workshops throughout the Diocese at the end of the summer. Attendance at one of these sessions is mandatory for any and all employees and volunteers who minister to children on regular basis or has regular contact with children and young people (all persons who work more than three hours per month or more frequently than once a month). All sessions will begin at 6:30 p.m. and will conclude at 9:00 p.m. The workshops are scheduled as follows:

Tuesday, August 25th, St. Mary Social Hall, Marietta
Thursday, September 3, St. Mary Church Hall, St. Clairsville
Tuesday, September 8, Catholic Central H.S., Steubenville
Tuesday, September 15, St. Louis Church Hall, Gallipolis.

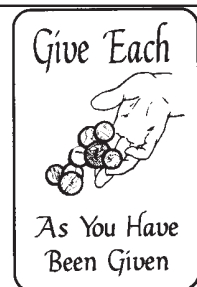
