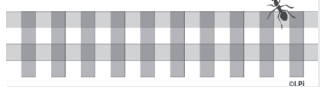


Picnic

Dear Parishioners, the assessments for Triumph of the Cross to the Catholic Schools for the 2010 - 2011 school year is as follows:

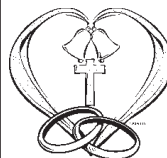
Catholic Central High School	\$74,217.00
BJKM - Elementary	\$103,741.00
BJKM - Junior High	\$34,580.00

That is a total amount of **\$212,538.00** is used from our parish collections to support Catholic Education. Each month we pay \$17,711.50 to the schools before paying our own utility expenses, payroll, insurance payments, diocesan monthly assessment and maintenance needs.

EXCHANGE STUDENT PROGRAM: Scores of predominantly Catholic high school students have been wait-
ing for as long as six months for a host family to claim them. Many families who volunteer to host a foreign
exchange student learn about the program through announcements in their churches. Hopefully, someone in
your congregation will become one of our new host families for a student coming here to study for the 2010-
11 academic year.

P.E.A.C.E. is an ecumenical Christian-oriented exchange student program designated by the US Department
of State since 1990. We specialize in US-Latin American high school placements; but our newest emerging
market is the Far East: currently Korea and China. Our Latino teens are mainly Catholic. Our Koreans are
mainly Protestant. Some Chinese are not Christian, but all are open to learning as a prerequisite for getting
into this program. These students are high achievers who will be leaders in their communities as adults.
They can gain the best understanding of the United States and its people through participation in everyday,
Christian-American family life and school activities while they perfect their English language skills. Mostly all
go to private schools in their country. Some can afford to attend our Catholic schools, especially the Chinese
who need to hear the Gospel.

A host family can gain insight into another culture, as well as help to shape a future leader's perception of
our country. Both student and host family have the opportunity to form a lifelong bond of friendship. Fami-
lies have no financial obligation other than providing the student's room and board. Many have a high
schooler in the home, but couples with small children, no children and even widows have all hosted success-
fully.

All program participants are carefully screened. P.E.A.C.E. handles school enrollments, provides students'
airfare, health insurance, monthly monitoring, bilingual counseling, plus a weeklong educational field trip in
the Spring. Students bring their own money for clothes, entertainment, phone bills, and personal expenses.

Warm, friendly families now needed to host predominately catholic foreign exchange students for the coming
school year. Students provide their own spending money, insurance, and airfare. Families provide room,

In March, Sr. Anne Marie Gill began a medical leave of absence from our program and for this reason will not be able to return to her role as coordinator of our program. Hopefully you have been remembering to pray for her and continue to do so. **She is a very important part of our community.**



As you saw in bulletin announcements the position was opened. We had seven very qualified individuals apply for the position. It was truly a blessing to see such gifted people willing to offer their services to our youth. From these individuals we have selected **Mr. John K. Beaulieu** to serve as the coordinator for the **Senior High Youth Ministry in Steubenville for the parishes of Holy Family, St. Peter and Triumph of the Cross.**

John will continue his work at Franciscan University as **Director of Youth Outreach** which includes the responsibility of planning and executing the programming for the high school youth conferences that serve 38,000 teens across the United States and Canada. He also brings to us thirteen years of full-time youth ministry experience on the parish level and has a unique perspective on the needs of Catholic Youth through his involvement with youth ministry on a national and international level.

He is very familiar with the graces and challenges of our local program. During the past three years he has served on the Core Team and worked with our youth. John and his wife Lisa were foundational in making the involvement of our youth in the local conference possible.

We consider ourselves very blessed to have John and Lisa accept this leadership position in the ministry to our youth in grades 9 through 12.
